Sculptor Joyce Gottlieb's work is on display in Farmington Hills Branch Library and the photographs of Jack Sellers are on display in Farmington Branch Library through the month of May.

Gottlieb is a first year member of Farmington Artists Club who says she works "to find the vibes" of her model-subjects. She has studied at Center for Creative Studies, took her degree in fine arts from Wayne State University and her master's in art from Eastern Michigan University.

Her realistic pieces have been on display at Eastern Michigan University, Michigan Sculptures Guild, the Celebrate Life Exhibit, In Palate and Brush Cub shows and Art on the Ridge shows.

Sellers' collection is the first exhibit of photography ever sponsored

by Farmington Artists Club, which uses wall space in the libraries for shows of their own members.

His work in photography began as a hobby, but has developed into a full-time avocation after retirement from Michigan Bell. Meanwhile he helped organize both the Detroit Mi-

The Jacobs described Alcoholics for Christ as a non-denominational, non-profit Christian fellowship.

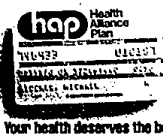

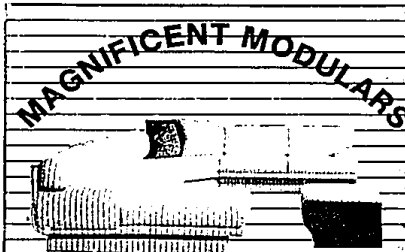
