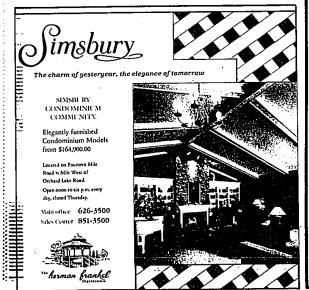

'Il Trovatore': Quality all the way

Since its premiere season in 1971, Michigan Opera Theatre has striven to bring to its audiences the best—the most exciting new singers, the most effective productions, and the highest quality stage direction.

The company is one of the few regional opera companies that managed to challenge the yearly onslaught of the Metropolitan Opera, and thrive. Today, it is one of the 10 largest opera companies in North America with subscriptions increasing at a rate of 35 necesor.

Saturday evening at Masonic Temple, those efforts surfaced again with a blockbuster production of an old favorite, "Ill Treatore," already sold out for two of its three performances; it was that special kind of evening — endless numbers of curtain calls and the kind of excitement we have come to associate with "grand opera."

The leads were spectacular — an old MOT friend, Leona Mitchell, at the pinnacle of her career; a controversial gypsy, Livia Budaj, fresh from her debut on national televison in the same role; a new star, Italian tenor Lando Bartolini, on his way to his debut at the Micropollian Opera in the same role; an American baritone, James Dietsch, now building a successful career in Europe, and a young Detroit school teacher, Claritha Buggs, who won the 1986 District Metropolitan Opera Auditions.

MICHAEL GALLUP'S securely delivered lead-off aria, "Ab-pletta zingara," as Ferrando, set the stage for what the ending field with a forceful declaration of the grizzly story of hatred

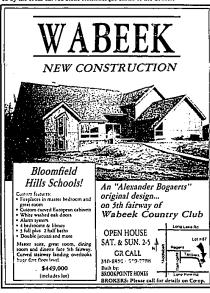

Bartolin's two powerful arias' Alb 15, her mio' and 'Di quella pira' were as stirring as Mitchell's 'Miserere' scene was moving. His makeup paired him easily with his long-lost brother, Count di Luna, James Dietsch, dust a MOT has dont so many times in the past, it has brought significant calculdication of the Detroit stage to experiently. Bandolin certainly proved his merit Saturday evening with his full cheeted high C.

At three major European houses, Mitchell debuted as Leonora, one of her most successful roles. The sheer beauty and grace in her voice allows her to handle the dramatic Verdi melodies, the reason she has been so successful in this role.
