CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING MAY 9, 1988

Mayor Sorenson opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on May 9, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Mayor Sorenson, Mayor Pro-Tem Sever, Alkateeb, Dolan, Fox, Marks, and Vagstad. Others present: City Manager Costello, City Clerk Reynolds, Assistant City Manager Call, Director of Public Services Blaisell, and City Attorney Bilean.

Council approved the agenda, as amended.

Council accepted Attorney's report.

Council approved demolition of dangerous building at 22115 Springbrook in accordance with Section 20.140 of the City Code.

Council enacted Ordinance C-16-88, to amend Chapter 10, Article VII - Natural Beauty Roads, to add major roads to be designated and maintained as Natural Beauty Roads and approved Natural Beauty Petitioner Guidelines for Local Roads.

Council adopted resolution to amend Section 5.02.C (Eligibility and Filing Procedure) and Section 2.06 (Remuneration of Council Members) of the Charter, as amended.

Council directed staff to evaluate and report to Council on a request from Commerce Township for sanitary sewer service for the development of the Newberry Plaza Shopping Center at the southwest corner of Haggerty and Fourteen Mile Road.

Council authorized the installation of a traffic signal on Eleven Mile Road between Inlander and Middlebelt.

Council adopted modifications of City seal.

Council adopted resolution to replace yield signs for north and southbound Westmeath at Wicklow with stop signs.

Council adopted resolution for the construction of walks along the west side of Orchard Lake from Orchard Community College to the proposed bridge widening at I-696 and bridge widening at I-696 north to the intersection of Twelve Mile and Orchard Lake Roads.

Council adopted resolution activating Section 5.06 of the City Charter to create a Department of Planning and Community Development and approved the appointment of Dale Couteau as its director.

Council scheduled 1988/89 Operating and Capital budget hearing study sessions for May 18 and May 23, 1988.

Council approved the minutes of April 4, 18, and 23, 1988, as published.

Council adopted resolution concerning request for transfer of employment of Librarian Plastics, Inc. from the City of Farmington Hills to the City of Westland.

Meeting adjourned at 10:55 p.m.
