

### cop calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

**MAN ROBBED**  
A 36-year-old West Bloomfield Township man was robbed of his wallet containing \$120 while pumping gas at Shell Oil, 32950 Middlebelt, May 14.  
According to a Farmington Hills police report:  
The man was pumping gas at 9:15 p.m. in front of the station when another car pulled in on the opposite side of the gas island. A man thought to be in his 20s exited the passenger door and approached him. He then demanded money, shoving a pistol in the victim's side.

As the victim pulled cash from his wallet, the gunman grabbed the wallet and told him to get back into his car. The gunman then got back into the getaway car, driven by another man. They left southbound on Middlebelt.

**MAILBOXES DAMAGED**  
Nine mailboxes on Danvers Court, Harwich and New Bedford were reported damaged about 11 a.m. May 13.  
A golf club iron and two large wood sticks were found in the car of the three juvenile suspects, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

**FALSE REPORT**  
A 30-year-old Farmington Hills

motorist who said he was robbed of his wallet and watch while stopped at a red light on Grand River near Botsford Drive May 10 made up the incident, investigators determined.  
"He filed a false police report," said Sgt. Charles Nebus of the Farmington Hills Police Department.  
The man had told officers that while stopped for a red light at 3:20 a.m., he noticed a car stopped behind him. Moments later, he heard a knock on the driver's window of his car and saw two men, one pointing a gun at him, the other holding a folded knife. He then was ordered to roll down his window, hand over his wallet and watch, and drive away.  
Investigation continues, Nebus said.

**LOUD PARTY**  
Officers from Farmington, Livonia and Redford Township helped Farmington Hills police break up a loud party with underage drinking at a house on Randall about 1:50 a.m. May 15.  
Six of the 20 party-goers were ticketed for disorderly conduct, interfering with a police officer or furnishing false identification to a police officer, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

**DRUGS FOUND**

## Biologist to address grizzly bears' demise

The North American grizzly bear is slowly finding its way onto the endangered species list.  
Christopher Servey, biologist with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, will lecture on this subject at the Smith Theater, Oakland Community College, Orchard Ridge Campus at 8 p.m. Tuesday. The program is sponsored by the Detroit Zoological Society.  
Servey has been studying grizzly bears for 10 years in the Montana wilderness and is now Grizzly Bear Recovery Program coordinator. He will discuss the process in which nuisance bears that are no longer suitable for relocation in the wild are given to select zoos throughout the country. After breeding takes place, the offspring will be placed with

female black bears in a cross-breeding experiment. Servey will discuss the Detroit Zoo's role in this project.

The Detroit Zoological Society is a non-profit organization formed to encourage memberships and provide Detroit Zoological Parks with financial support for new exhibits, major renovations, educational programs and wildlife purchases.

## Odyssey wins state

A 7-member Odyssey of the Mind team from Warner Middle School in Farmington Hills will compete with international teams, after winning first place in state competition April 30.  
Twenty-five teams competed at Central Michigan University in Mt. Pleasant.  
The Warner group, made up of boys and girls, now moves on to world competition at the University of Maryland in June.  
The Odyssey of the Mind competition is held worldwide. It is designed to teach problem-solving skills and stresses team dynamics.

It was formerly known as Olympics of the Mind, or OM Competition. Students work within their grade level divisions, in creative approaches to problem solving.  
The Warner team built a submersible vessel with two remote arms that collected artifacts from the lost continent of Atlantis. The team created a scenario that included a sea monster and other conflicts.
