

Fish finders

Gloria Torello, a fisheries technician with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, checks the length of a nice walleye caught during last week's DNR netting survey on Bolleville Lake. Black crappie were the most abundant fish netted, ranging in size from 6-11 inches. Also there were bluegill up to 10 inches long, walleye up to 20 inches, 10-38-inch catflish and assorted largemouth, smallmouth and silver bass, pumpkinseed, perch, builhead, suckers and carp. The DNR will conclude the study with an electrofishing survey this fall. These surveys are conducted by the DNR every five years on all southeastern Michigan lakes with public access alter. The study coincides with the water level on Belleville Lake being returned to normal after being down for two years while repairs were made on the French Landing Dam.

ACCORDING TO the National

Freshwater Fishing Hall of Fame, many anglers consume trophy fish each week without realizing the din-ner they just ate may have been a line class or even all-tackle record

The hall receives calls each week from frantle anglers with questions about the size of record flah, many times after the fish in question has been eaten.

Now is the time to call or write to the Fishing Hall of Fame for the free rules, guidelines and application forms to establish a world record. The process is a free public service.

Records are kept in all-tackle (heaviest) and all-line classes (strength of the line used) for more than 100 species of fish.

Smaller, less popular species of fish are usually easier to establish a world record in rod & reel, fly fishing, pole/line/no reel or lee fishing categories since many anglers ignore these fish.

Record setters receive certifi-cates, garment patches and pins along with a listing in the world book of records, a 60-page publication documenting the catch as official.


