

Hawks finished; Mercy rolls on

Farmington Harrison ended its girls soccer season on a positive note despite suffering defeat Monday, and Farmington Mercy advanced in district play to set up a midweek showdown with Farmington.

The Hawks finished with an 8-14 record, but they gave Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook a battle in the first round of Class B tournament action Monday at Harrison.

Cheryl Monahan, following a pass from Marie Najjar, pulled the Hawks even at 1-1 after the teams had played 28 minutes of the second half. Regulation play ended with the score still deadlocked, but Cranbrook's Sandi Morelli scored the game-winning goal two minutes into sudden death.

"It shows how strong the Western Lakes is when we're the last-place team and come into the district and play a strong game," Harrison coach Glenn Bruehan said.

"We played the best game of the season by far. (The Harrison players) made the season for me."

"When we get out of the Western Lakes and play others, we do a lot better," he added.

Harrison's boys team, also coached by Bruehan, took its lumps in the WLAA last fall but came on at

the end of the season and advanced to the Class B semifinals.

The victory paired Mercy against Farmington in a battle for city supremacy in the second round of the district Wednesday.

Dana Lehmkuhl scored two goals for the Marlins, 9-4-1 overall, and Stacy Nolte, Kathy McDonald and Michelle Geyer accounted for one each.

Kelly Beaudry made five saves in goal for Mercy, which attempted 18 shots. Colleen Raftery assisted on two Marlin goals, Erica James, Karen Baldas and Rachel Demasico one apiece.

"We played strong offensively during both halves," Mercy coach Gene Fogel said, "but they have a nice goal and strong defenders."

"They play in the toughest soccer league in the state, and they are very battle-tested and strong."

Harrison wins state qualifier

Farmington Harrison got its predistrict qualifier over with in a hurry Tuesday, defeating Dearborn St. Alphonsus in a five-inning mercy game, 15-5.

Harrison, 4-16 overall, advances to district play Friday at 4 p.m. against Royal Oak Shrine at Harrison. St. Alphonsus fell to 14-10. Harrison sent 20 batters to the plate in the fourth, scoring 14 runs on 11 walks and five hits.

Jenny Isenberg and Katie Doll had four of Harrison's six hits. Doll had three RBI and Isenberg drove in one run and scored two for the Hawks.

Keri Priessorn gave up five hits in recording the win for Harrison. She walked three; whereas, the St. Alphonsus pitching staff issued 16 free passes.

On Monday, Trish Kosikowski tossed a two-hitter at Harrison, leading Livonia Stevenson to an 8-3 Western Lakes win.

Priessorn took the loss for Harrison and was the victim of a home run by Stevenson's Dorie Rau. Robyn Cohen and Doll accounted for Harrison's only hits.

REGINA 3, MERCY 2: The Catholic League title went to Dearborn Woods Regina Sunday at Dearborn's King Boring Field. Farmington Mercy, the visitors led 1-0 and 2-1, but Regina scored two runs with two out in the bottom of the sixth to solidify the verdict.

Mercy ends its regular season at 22-8 and will be host to Livonia Ledywood in district play Friday at 2:30 p.m.

The bottom of Mercy's order did the most damage Sunday, with the sixth hitter, Lisa Cook, collecting two hits and scoring both runs. Cyndi Viall, the eighth batter, batted in both runs.

Kristin Orlandoni, Nicki Fraser and Julie Jozwiak had one hit each, but Mercy coach Suzanne Browne is looking for more production out of the top of her lineup.

Farmington plans track title defense

Farmington will have the opportunity to defend its state championship in the boys 3,200-meter relay at the Class A track and field finals on Saturday, June 4.

The Falcons set a state record of 7:50.02 when Ron Smedley, Chris Inch, Al Stobbins and Brandon London won the event in last year's finals.

Two members of that team helped Farmington win the same race Saturday in the regional at West Bloomfield.

Veterans Smedley and London were joined by newcomers Matt Walter and Tom Hundt as the Falcons ran 8:03.8. Pontiac Central was second at 8:04.1.

"THEY CAN RUN under eight minutes, but I don't know if that will be good enough (to win the state again)," Farmington coach Dave Catherman said. "We think we can be in the top five."

London also qualified for state in the 800 run, finishing second in 1:58.8 behind Pontiac Central's Michael Turner (1:57.2).

The Falcons, who were 12th out of 19 teams with 28 points, had a pair of fourth places: Smedley in the 1,600 run (4:32.2) and Mike Neal in the discus (142-5).

Farmington's 800 and 400 relay teams were seventh and just missed scoring points. Lamont Hardage was seventh in the 200 dash, also.

In the same regional, Warren Johnson scored North Farmington's only point by taking sixth place in the long jump.

HE WASN'T FAR off the mark, however. Johnson jumped 20 feet, 5 1/2 inches, and the winning distance was 20-11.

In the Class B boys regional at Madison Heights, Farmington Harrison was third. The Hawks (70 1/2 points) were regional champs at Linden last year, but a pair of Detroit powers, Benedictine (99) and East Catholic (84), finished in front of them this year.

Harrison, however, qualified three relays and individuals in seven events for the Class B state

meet on Saturday, June 4, at Sturgis High School.

Bob Conlon will compete in the high jump (6-4) and high hurdles (14-8) after finishing second in both. The top two in each event automatically qualify for state.

Wes Wood and Chad Burgess were regional winners in the intermediate hurdles and 800 run, respectively. Wood was clocked at 39.5, Burgess 1:59.2.

MARK BONASSO in the discus (137-6), Bob Deauchamp in the 100 dash (11.1) and Aaron Yaverski in the 200 sprint (22.3) round out the list of individual qualifiers.

Beauchamp, Conlon, Wood and Yaverski are on the 800 relay team (1:31.5), Chris Hart, Pat Runk, Burgess and Dave Foss the 3,200 outfit (8:04.2) and Hart, Burgess, Yaverski and Wood the 1,600 squad (5:25.4).

In non-qualifying roles, Runk was fifth and Foss sixth in the 1,600 run with 4:41.1 and 4:44.3 times, and Jeff Barringer ran 10:15.6 to place fifth in the open 3,200.
