## Mercy Aging opens retirement facility in Rochester Hills

Mercy Belbrook, the first not-for-profit retirement community providing a continuum of care in northern Oakland County, opened May 18.

Located in Rochester Hills, Mercy Belbrook is co-sponsored by Mercy Services for Aging and St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Pontiac. MSA and St. Joseph Mercy are owned by Farmington Hills-based Mercy Health Services, a sponsored work of the Sisters of Mercy, Province of Detroit.

"The opening is a joyous occasion for all of us at Mercy Services for Aging. We are committed to our goals of providing independence and quality health care for all our future friends at Mercy Belbrook," said Catherine Price, executive vice president of Mercy Services for Aging. Three programs are offered in Phase I of the project: skilled nursing, assisted living and apartment living. Condominium units are under development for Phase II.

The health center, designed for people unable to live independently

due to illness or injury, comprises 66 skilled nursing beds and 54 assisted living beds.

For independent seniors, there are 144 one- and two-bedroom apartments plus an array of services including:

- Oak Glen Room, for elegant dining.
  - Cracker Barrel, a coffee shop and convenience store.
  - Hair Port, a beauty and barber shop.
  - A library.
  - Post office.
  - Overnight guest suites.
  - A medical clinic.
- A continuum of care helps relieve such worries. If a person becomes ill or injured, nursing, convalescent care and therapy are available on the premises — the individual needn't leave friends and home to receive the appropriate care. If mobility is limited or personal transportation is no longer advisable, shopping assistance is also accessible.

**CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)**

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Tupper at 8:00 p.m. on May 16, 1988, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

**PRESENT:** Campbell, Harisock, Tupper, Yoder.

**ABSENT:** Richardson.

**OTHERS PRESENT:** City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lauboff, City Attorney Kelly, Adm. Asst. Schultz, City Clerk Busby.

Minutes of the previous meeting of May 2, 1988, were read and approved.

Council held a Public Hearing to review the 1988-89 Budget and Millage Rate. Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Council granted permission to the Farmington Festival Committee to conduct the annual parade on July 16, 1988.

Council denied the request of Common Ground for funding.

Council issued a proclamation designating the week of May 15, through 21, 1988, as **PUBLIC WORKS WEEK**.

Council authorized the expansion of the building at 33313 Grand River in accordance with the site plan approved by the Planning Commission, and approved a parking agreement with the owner.

Council authorized participation in the Oakland County Road Commission's cost sharing agreement for the improvement of Orchard Lake Road.

Council authorized an expenditure of \$6,209.00, the City's share of the cost for participation in the 1988 Tri-Party Road Improvement Program.

Council adopted an ordinance to adopt a sewer use rate ordinance, by reference, which will essentially conform with the ordinance proposed by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

Council approved the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission Budget as presented.

Council reviewed the City Manager's report on the Rouge River Cleanup.

Council approved the purchase of computer work stations and printers at a total cost of \$14,812.

Public comments were heard.

Council received the Department of Public Safety Operations Report for January - March, 1988.

Council adopted a resolution placing on the 1988 tax rolls Delinquent Special Assessment payments, unpaid service invoices and water bills as certified by the City Treasurer.

Monthly bills were approved for payment.

Meeting adjourned at 9:31 p.m.
