good neighbor." Sylvia Pearl Perry, 84, died at 515 pm. Monday in Botsford General Hospital, Farmington Hills, from injuries sustained in the accident, which occurred at 245 pm. on Sungdaie, near Eight Mile and Orchard Lake roads.

"She often would bring extra food to neighbors," said Kim Gouine, a neighbor for four years. "Even if you told her you didn't need it, she'd leave it anyway."
Gouine said she and her husband often lent Perry a hand — cutting the grass, doing home repairs, watching her dogs.

Perry was struck by a bumper and run over by a wheel, but was alert and speaking at the scene, Fradette said. She died later of multiple injuries, according to the Oakland County Medical Examiner.

"There were a lot of unfavorable factors," Fradette said. "The driver was seated higher in a four-wheel-drive truck, the woman was only 5 feet tail and she was crouching."

No charges are pending, Fradette said.
