Cable show offers teen employment tips

Although summer vacation has already begun for many high school students, it's still not too late to find a summer job.

That's the advice two Michigan Employment Security Commission Job Service specialists offer on the cable television program "The Job Show" airing June 5 on MetroVision Cable Channel 12.

Hugh Day, a Job Service counselor, suggests that teens who want work should let friends know they are job hunting, since friends who are employed may hear about vacancies at their company.

Job seekers should show a potential employer they are familiar with the company. "If it's a fast-

food place, you could tell the person you have eaten there. If it's the barbershop, you might have had your hair cut there."

Teens could demonstrate their reliability by mentioning a good school attendance record.

Darlene Reaser, Job Service supervisor at Detroit's Westside Job Service office, emphasizes the importance of filling out applications properly. An employer may even observe an applicant working on the application to see if he or she can follow directions, according to Reaser. She also reminds job seekers to bring all the information they will need to fill out the forms, such as names and addresses of previous employers and the

dates of employment.

Day concludes that the initial impressions an employer gets about an applicant is extremely important. "The first time that person sees you they're going to see you as if you were working the job."

This edition of "The Job Show" will also feature information on the state of Michigan's Tuition Incentive Program, which will provide money for tuition and fees to enable eligible young people to attend community colleges.

The final topic on this week's program will feature some of the MESC brochures on a variety of topics available free of charge to the public.
