

## TV-10 students win awards

Three cable TV-10 students from the Farmington school district were second place winners in the 1988 National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences Student Award for Excellence Competition. Meredith Bachman, Mary Potts and Jason Schwankl, all student interns at the station, won the awards for their public service announcements titled "R.I.P.," "The Druggie" and "The House That Crack Built." The original productions, focusing on alcohol and drug abuse, were chosen from 45 entries

and will be aired on Channel 56 in Detroit. Students also fared well in entries to the Detroit Area Film Teachers 19th Annual Michigan Student Film and Video Festival. In the General Entertainment category, "Technical Difficulties," produced by Keith Croket and Jon Whittner, won first place and "Gunshow: The Mailed Falcon," produced by Jason Schwankl, won second place. Meredith Bachman and Jason Schwankl won certificates of recognition.

All of these student productions are aired on TV-10 on a regular basis. The station cablecasts in Novi, Farmington Hills and Farmington and is based at North Farmington High School, although students from all three public high schools participate in student productions.

The station is on the air from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and Thursdays 6-8 p.m.
