Funeral services will be conducted Monday, Sept. 30, at 2 p.m. in the Livonia Baptist Church. Friends may call at the Thayer Funeral Home on Saturday and Sunday to offer condolences. Burial will be to Glen Eden Memorial Park.

His parents visited with him two weeks ago in Hawaii. "He looked great," Mrs. Tate said. Tate was engaged to Linda Goodell, 19, of Livonia. She accompanied the Tates to Hawaii and it was there that the couple decided to become engaged. They had planned to marry upon his release from the Marines.

He enlisted for three years in 1968 and had reached the rank of lance corporal. At the time of his death he had served in Vietnam for seven months.

Additional survivors are a brother, Eddie, 20, who is in the U.S. Army Officers School at Ft. Belvoir, Va.; a grandmother and a great grandmother in West Virginia.

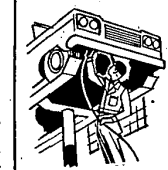
