Chris Wharton, a fifth grader at Longacre School, created 'The Baseball Blunt.' He is interested in mineralogy and often uses his art talents to draw minerals.

ART IS but one of the many talents of third grader Inge Baesler, who created the strip called 'Love at the Park.' The student at Flanders has won awards in photography and the PTA's 'Reflections' competition.

Drew Cunningham is not sure if he's going to be an artistic scientist or a scientific artist. The fifth grader at Longacre created the strip called 'Space Ship.'

Richard Prekop, better known to his fellow-fourth grade students at Woodcreek as R.P., created the strip called 'The Royal' but prefers working with oil paints.

Lemieux won't be heading up the 'Cartooning' classes sponsored by Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department this summer because she's taken a full-time job at Alpha Graphics in Farmington Hills.

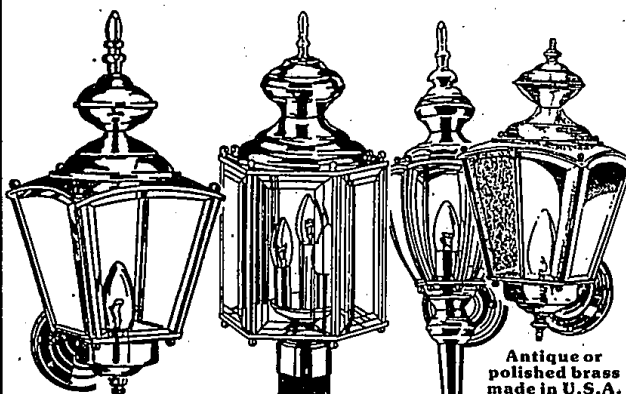
