

Max Fisher backs Sarafa for House

News and notes from the Election '88 campaign trail. The primary is Aug. 2. The general election is Nov. 8.

FISHER BACKS SARAFI

Max Fisher, a longtime leader in the Michigan Republican Party and the state's business community, has endorsed Farmington Hills resident Mike Sarafa in his bid for the Republican nomination for the 69th District state House seat.

"Mike Sarafa has my full support," said Fisher, a Farmington Hills resident. "I am impressed with his energy and his insight, and I find his approach to area concerns intelligent and reasonable. Mike Sarafa deserves everyone's consideration."

The 69th district includes Farmington, Farmington Hills, Beverly Hills, Franklin and Bingham Farms.

WOMAN ASSAULTED

A Farmington Hills woman returning home after jogging managed to slip away when a nude man tried to force her into his van Monday evening.

The 12th Estate Condos resident, in her 20s, was at her door at 8:50 p.m. when a van pulled up nearby. The nude driver grabbed her arm and shirt and pulled her toward the van. After she kicked him in the thigh and managed to slip away, he drove off.

The man was described as stocky, well tanned, 6-0 and 200 pounds with blond, medium length hair parted down the middle. His van was described as white with red and blue lettering or plating on the side and a spare tire on the back, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

ELEVATOR FIRE

A deliberately set fire caused about \$500 in damage to a second-floor elevator at the Holiday Inn of Farmington Hills, 38123 10 Mile, Monday night.

"Someone placed and ignited newspapers between the wood ceiling and the plastic grating below it," said investigator Al Ellis of the Farmington Hills Fire Department. The fire alarm sounded at 7:15 p.m. Management was ready to evacuate guests but hotel employees contained and extinguished the fire quickly, Ellis said.

Flames charred ceiling wood and melted plastic grating, Ellis said.

CAR TAKEN

A car left unlocked and with the key in the ignition was stolen from Speedway, 29250 Eight Mile, when the owner went inside to pay for gasoline she had just pumped at 9 p.m. June 11.
