

Youth Assistance sets summer slate

Farmington Youth Assistance will once again operate a Teen Summer Activities Center in Shawassee School, 20415 Shawassee, Farmington Hills.

The center will open Wednesday, June 22, and run to Aug. 10. Hours will be 3-9 p.m., Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Wednesday will be reserved for field trips.

Activities will be geared toward youngsters entering the eighth grade up to 16-year-olds.

As in the past, the center will provide a structured recreational and social setting for teens during warm summer evenings when there is "nothing to do."

Many free activities will be

available. They include video games, sports, pool table, air hockey and table tennis.

On hand will be a director and staff, who will provide supervision. They will also provide an "understanding ear" for youngsters who want someone to talk to.

Teens who want to participate in the program need a permission form signed by their parents. Forms can be picked up at the center during operating hours or at the FYA office in Shawassee School. Only teens who live in the Farmington/Farmington Hills area will be allowed to participate.
