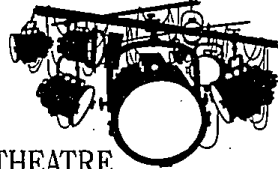
Oscar Cook is a past president and a 45-year member of Marshall Sub-
