Fredericks Gallery open 3 July weekends

The Marshall M. Fredericks Gallery on the campus of Saginaw Valley State University, dedicated in May, will be open to the public, free of charge, for three weekends in July: 2-3, 9-10 and 16-17. Hours and tours will be from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The gallery will officially open in the fall. Among the many sculptures for which Fredericks is known nationwide is the 28-foot bronze figure of Christ on the cross at Indian River. The original plaster mold of the figure is on display in the gallery, along with other plasters for his larger-than-life-size works.

Just beyond the gallery is an outdoor sculpture garden. One of the most spectacular bronzes there is

"Night and Day," a male and female figure in the center of an outdoor reflecting pool in the garden. "Leaping Gazelle" is in the Fountain Plaza in the heart of the campus.

In addition to the bronzes and plasters in the gallery and the dozen bronzes outside, extensive documentation in photographs and mementoes of Fredericks's career is featured.

The gallery is in the Arbury Fine Arts Center, named for university supporters Ned and Dorothy Arbury of Midland. The building was designed by Hideo Fujii of Ralph Calder and Associates of Detroit.

Saginaw State University is east of I-75 at exit 160, north of Saginaw.
