"I honestly think he's got a better chance in the 200," said Hovland. "But he looked good in the 100 in December (at the U.S. Open meet). I just think he's more middle-distance oriented, the way he's built (6-foot-5, 185-pounds).
Chlef competition for VanderMey should come from an old nemesis: Jelf Kublak, a 1987 grad of California State-Northridge. In both '86 and '87, the two staged a two-man battle at the Division II finals in the 100 and 200, ending up with a victory each both years.
With Steve Lundquist, the world record-holder in the 100-meter breast, retiring, many other post-graduates (like Kublak) have returned to training in hopes of landing a spot on the U.S. team.
