

Nature buoys day camp

Signup continues

HERITAGE PARK'S Camp Com-On-A-Wonna concentrates on both educational and recreational programming in a natural setting.

Campers ages 9-12 study animal life, insects, plant life and geology. The fare includes camp craft, nature lore, archery, campfire programs and field trips.

On Thursday evenings of camp week, campers attend a campfire program with their families. Families bring a picnic dinner.

The Farmington Hills Department of Special Services Recreation Division sponsors the camp.

OPENINGS EXIST in each of the remaining five week-long sessions. Camp time is 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. except Thursday when it's 2-7:30 p.m. Heritage Park is on the west side of Farmington Road, south of 11 Mile.

Campers need to bring a sack lunch; a beverage is provided. They should dress for the outdoors.

The weekly fee is \$10.

Heritage Park, the 210-acre former farmstead of the Spiller family, has been transformed into a passive recreational refuge for Farmington Hills residents of all ages. The park boasts a variety of flora and fauna and habitats.

It is the backdrop for day campers of varying ages: 3-5, 6-8, 9-12. Sessions for all end Aug. 19. Call the recreation division to determine enrollment availability.
