BUT D'ALEXANDER, who led the University of Arkansas this season in home runs as a sophomore, redeemed himself in the bottom of the inning when he hit a Tom Cotter forkball into the upper deck in left field.

"I've played six or seven times here," said the Allen Park Cabini High graduate. "The first time I played here as a junior, I went 3-for-4. As a senior I hit one in the lower deck."

While D'Alexander was breaking the ice for Detroit, Livonia's pitching staff began to cool, although Thurston High grad Chris Kloe, the Livonia starter, worked two scoreless innings. Little Caesars teammate Rob Jamula followed with another to keep Detroit off the board for three innings.

But the two right-handers had plenty of defensive help in the early going. Catcher Derrick Dowling threw out a runner trying to steal in the first. Shortstop Brian Smolinski and second baseman Brian Smolinski, both of Walter's Appliances, turned a double play to get out of the inning.

But the defensive play of the game was turned in by right fielder Keith Dukiewicz of Tom Holter Ford, who made a diving catch to rob Mickey Smerek of an extra-base hit in the third.

"THAT WAS A great catch," said

Atkins. "They made a couple of nice defensive plays."

Cotter, who graduated from North Farmington High and attends Central Michigan, managed to get just one out while giving up three additional runs in the fourth.

Detroit then tagged Cotter's replacement, Shawn Uzarski (Caesars) for four more runs (on three walks).

"Cotter and Uzarski threw a lot of pitches. We just couldn't get the ball over the plate."

In the second game of the All-Star Program, Detroit pounded the Lansing All-Stars, 13-5.

South blasts Mantle foes

South Farmington chalked up some impressive numbers while rolling over a pair of Mickey Mantle baseball opponents last week.

South batters produced 19 hits en route to a 21-2 clobbering of Southfield on Thursday, and the team was just slightly less overpowering Tuesday when it trounced Riverview 14-4.

Unbeaten and league-leading Westland had been forced into extra innings two days before by Riverview, which was 12-2 going into its game with South, now 12-4-1 in the league and 17-6-1 overall.

In the five-inning game with Southfield, winning pitcher Les Luark had a no-hitter going until the fifth when the leadoff batter connected on the first pitch.

Luark, who struck out 10, finished with a one-hitter, but he walked 11 in the process, including five in the last inning.

THE TREND, according to coach Lou Pironello, had Luark creating his own problems with walks and then bearing down to strike out the side.

James Alexander led the overwhelming offensive display with a 4-for-4 game and five RBI. He also had a walk and reached base every time, and he stole two bases to boot.

Paul Pironello and Ben Underwood were 3-for-3

with a pair of doubles and one RBI apiece.

Dave Miracle was 2-for-4 with a triple and three RBI, Luark 2-for-3 with two RBI and Chris Schmidt 2-for-2 with one RBI. Kevin Vanord chipped in with a two-run single.

In the Riverview game, South struck early for seven runs in the bottom of the first inning, doing all the damage after the first two batters struck out.

Pironello started it with a triple and scored on Miracle's base hit. Schmidt put the ball in play for a bases-loaded error that scored two runs, Vanord and Pironello walked with the bases loaded and Billy Hardy hit a two-run single.

PIRRONELLO ENDED up 2-for-2, Hardy and Miracle 2-for-4 and Alexander 2-for-3. Miracle later smashed a three-run homer and finished with four RBI, Hardy three and Pironello two.

Schmidt, who will be a junior at Farmington High in the fall, was the winning pitcher in relief of Hardy.

He allowed only one hit and an unearned run over the last 3 1/2 innings, and he lowered his earned run average from its previous standing of 0.84. He struck out seven and walked four.

Hardy went 1 1/2 innings but ran into trouble in the second when he walked five batters and Riverview scored three runs. He gave up just one hit, however.

Errors cause NFWB's downfall

Despite flashes of defensive excellence, North Farmington-West Bloomfield has not been able to avoid the occasional lapses that have dogged the ballclub.

NFWB made four errors Thursday in an important North Oakland County League game, and the mis-

takes contributed to a 6-4 loss to Cranbrook in a Connie Mack contest.

NFWB coach Rich Rachner noted his team is averaging one error per game when it wins as opposed to three or four when it loses.

"There's clearly a high correlation

between our defense and the final score," he said. "It seems every time we make an error, we really pay for it."

"The pitching has been reasonably consistent, but our defense has been either very good or very bad," he added.
