Of all the unpleasant experience we encounter, I believe criticism ranks among the most vestig.

The Book of Proverbs declares, "Rebuke a wise man and he will bless thee." But most of us know from experience that we get precious few blessings from those we rebuke, and we are seldom wise enough to thank our critics for their reproofs.

Criticism is perceived as a blow to our ego, a threat to our self-satem. Critical words hurt, sometimes even more than physical pain.
Criticism hurts most when it comes from those we love. We want to look good to others, and most of all, we want to look good to our profests, our spouse, our children. Our hearts are so designed that one word or reproof from them appears as a threat. It is felt as a withdrawal of love, a rejection.

Does love mean total acceptance of one's partner in marriage, of one's children in everything they do? If we truly love another, we seek to enhance the life of the other. When love is not blind, but critical, then it leads to the growth and development of those who are close and dear to us.

The wife will say, "My husband does that which I do not like." I ask, "Have you told him how you feel about it and why?" She responds, "I told him a thousand times!"

When I mention this problem to the husband, he says, "I never heard her say a single word about it." I be-lieve him, and I believe her, too. She criticized, but he did not listen.

THE SECOND step is to admit that we are not perfect. This is a hard admission to make. We learn so much about normal psychology from abnormal. Those who study the alcoholic personality articulate this truth. It is hard to admit you have a serious fault that needs correcting.

admit that he is an alcoholic, that he has a drinking problem and needs help."

And so it is with all of us. We have to admit our imperfections and fallures in order to overcome them.

Frequently, our severest critic and dearest friend are one and the same. Who loves us better, who knows us more inlimately, who accepts us as we are even with our faults and criticizes us more often than a parent or a spouse?

THIS DIMENSION of human in-teraction has broad implications. The very life of a democracy de-pends on people giving and taking criticism. The difference between a dictatorship and a democracy is not discerned simply in the structure of government.

The true distinction is this: do the citizens have the right and the freedom to crilicize their government? If they do, they live in a democracy. If they don't, a dictatorship.

The worst thing that could happen to America is that critics of national or local polley should be silenced or become silent. The constructive re-sponse to criticism makes for a healthy and vigorous democratic so-clety.
