Forfeitures aid drug crackdown

The Farmington Hills Police Department is taking the profit out of illegal drug sales through use of the 1882 state forfeiture laws.

Police haven't nabbed an expensive yacht or mansion but they are potting to use the public act that pinches drug dealers where it hurst—

In the last 24 years, the police department has acquired, through forfeiture, items totaling 389,000 in value — \$20,000 of which is still pending before the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

Part of the department's total includes proceeds from the Oakland County Narcotics Enforcement Team, Farmington Hills police Calef William Dwyer said. Farmington Hills police Calef William Dwyer said. Farmington Hills participates in NET and annually sends an officer to work with the "Porfeiture is administrative rather than criminal," Dwyer said. "An administrative hearing is held on anything that is pending, You have to prove that whatever you request for forfeiture was used in the area of narcotics trafficking."

Though Farmington Hills forfeitures don't rival the well-publicized and controversaft taking of an expensive luxury yacht in Florida carl

aren't peanuts for a suburban community. In the first six months of 1888, police have filled five forfeiture claims for items, including a house and three cars. Dever said.

"This whole forfeiture is the best thing that's happened to law enforcement," Dwyer said. "The way that forfeiture is structured, anything of value is turned back over into law enforcement for narcotics enforcement and education."

MARY-ROSE PROST, second deputy chief in the Detroit Police Department's legal affairs division, calls forfeiture an attempt "to diffuse the profits" of drug sales. "It gives us a chance to get even," she said.

Prost and Dwyer worked on the drafting Public Act 251 of 1992 when Dwyer served as commander with the Detroit department. The state public act mirrors the longstanding federal act, which allowed only fed-eral police agencies forfeiture rights.
"If you can, in the process" of a

criminal case, show they are generating money, you get everything they would have gotten from the profits. If you look at the amount of money seized — it's in the millions throughout the country — that money would be turned back into drugs and onto the streets, "Prost said.

Drug selling is a big and sophisticated business, always with yet another kitappin heir waiting in line should the ring leader be convicted and sent to prison. The accumulated and sent to prison. The accumulated hands. "If you take their money out of it, you crimp their style," Prost said.

When police benefit from the for-feiture act, the seized merchandise doesn't sit on police shelves gather-ing dust. In some cases, items such as cars or radios can be used by the police if they choose, Dwyer said. With forfeited houses that are of

With forfeited houses that are of little practical use to police departments, they can be sold. Once taxes

or any other liens are paid, the re maining money goes to the department to be used for narcotics enforcement and education, Dwyer said.

FARMINGTON HILLS forfeiture proceeds have been used to help finance the department's Crime Prevention Advisory Committee's antidrug and alcohol abuse campaign that began earlier this year. Money was used to buy bumper stickers and finance educational programs, Dwyers and

Prost said the public act "is fairly loose" on how forfeiture money may be spent. But it can be used to buy police equipment, anything that belps enforcement such as binoculars or cameras. It can also be used to pay wages such as for overtime on narcoties enforcement. In Detroil, forfeiture money is being used to renovate the department's crime lab.


