HARRY J. WILL

Mr. Will, 72, of Farmington Hills died June 22 in Providence Hospital, Southfield.

Mr. Will was the founder of the Harry J. Will Funeral Home, located in Detroit, Redford and Livonia. He bought the original location in 1942 and in 1985 opened the location in Redford. In June 1974 the third Will Funeral Home on Six Mile in Livonia was opened. He has served as secretary for the Michigan Funeral Directors Association District No. 1.

Mr. Will was prominent in Lutheran circles having served and chaired many committees and projects. He served on the board of the Lutheran Center, the Lutheran High School Association and Glen Eden Lutheran Cemetery. He was also Lutheran Man of the Year in 1979 in the Metropolitan Detroit Area. He was awarded the Soldier of Christ Award by the Concordia Seminary at Fort Wayne, Ind., in 1985.

He was chairman of the district board of Stewardship-English District 1983-85. He headed the English District program for the Missouri Synod's Forward in Remembrance Program obtaining over \$1 million

in pledges. He gave a major gift to this program to begin a new mission church in Pice Valley, Calif.

Mr. Will's hobbies included oil painting, refinishing antique furniture and gardening. Survivors include his wife of 47 years, Virginia; sons, James and Robert; daughters, Nancy Muzbeck and Kathleen Haas; brother, Christian; seven grandchildren.

Services were June 22 in Grace Lutheran Church, Detroit. Burial was in Glen Eden Memorial Cemetery, Livonia.

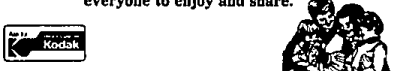
