Black gold fever

Houston firm surveys Hills for trapped oil, gas

The Houston-based Grant-Norpac
Co. has spent the last few weeks testlog Farmington Hills' underground

Grant-Norpac has been conducting
tests, similar to seismic tests used in
earthquake detection, along the

under county jurisdiction, Otwell
said.

pect to see a return of the specialized trucks that have been seen along the roadsides lately.
Grant-Norpac's tests will result in a two-dimensional substructure map of the city, but 7,000-8,000 feet underground. Geophones, which monitor motion much like earthquake tremors are monitored, are inserted into the ground in the rights of way. "It takes motion and induces a minute electrical impuise," Grote said.

minute electrical impulse," Grote said.

The testing equipment shakes the ground and measures the motion, With the measure of the motion, Grant-Norpac can determine whether there is natural gas or oil in the underground sandstone. The testing process is designed to locate anomolies — a bump in the underground structure, Grote said.

"Sometimes they (gas and oil) are found together."

When the testing is complete, Grant-Norpae will provide the company it is working for with a two-dimensional "silice of the earth," Grote said.

"You might think of it as looking like an ant farm," Grote said.
