ZONDER HAS spent this summer practicing a lot. I need to refine my skills. She's played just two tournaments, the High School Senior Girls Championship at Michigan State's Forest Acres in May and a girls invitational in Ohio two weeks ago.

Playing against the best high school senior girls in Michigan, Zonder tied for first with Shannon Hamel and Sarah Stiefel, both of Ann Arbor, with a 78. Stiefel won the playoff, earning a trip to the national tournament.

"They were in the middle of their (high school) season," said Zonder. "They hadn't even played their state championship yet. I thought that gave them the advantage. It was my first tournament of the year, so I was pretty happy."

At the Ohio invitational, Zonder recovered from a "horrible" first round to shoot 81 her second day. Although those are her only tournaments thus far this year, her handicap remains at five — same as it was for last year's O&E. And — take note, ladies — Zonder feels "this is the best I've played."

LAUER, WHO won O&E titles in 1983 and 1986, is expected to return and challenge Zonder. So is Waldeck.

Scots end soccer quest

Farmington United, a boys soccer team composed of players from all three city high schools, ended its season competing in the prestigious Robble International Soccer Tournament on the Fourth of July weekend.

After splitting its first two games in Toronto, Farmington faced a tough assignment in its next opponent from Hutchison Vale, Scotland. A win would have sent the Farmington squad into the quarterfinals, but the outcome was a 4-0 defeat.

The Scottish outfit, which had six professional players on its roster, according to Farmington coach John Bailey, had won its previous games by 12-0 and 7-0 counts.

"It took a perfect shot (for the Scots) to score one goal and some good Scottish luck on the other goals," United assistant coach Dave Rippin said. "It could very easily have been a 1-0 game."

Farmington dropped its first game 4-0 to a team from Scarborough, Ontario, and fell behind 2-0 in the next one to the Edmonton Strikers. Farmington, however, rallied in the second half for a 4-2 victory.

CRAIG BAILEY of Harrison High School started the scoring with a cross from Farmington's Scott Seabolt. Peter Keller (North Farmington) scored two of the last three goals and Raider teammate Roy Olani one.

"The kids were thrilled to be in the Robble and even more thrilled to have played a team (Hutchison Vale) of such world-class stature," coach Bailey said.

On Memorial Day weekend, Farmington United advanced to the quarterfinals of the Buckeye Invitational in Cincinnati before losing 1-0 to the eventual winner.
