

Mustangs finish on top in Series

South Farmington's Mustang baseball team (ages 9-10) can rightfully claim the title of "State Champions" after capturing the Michigan World Series on Monday.

South Farmington proved a resilient ballclub as it bounced back from its only loss to nail down first place in the tournament played at Waterford.

After winning its first four games, South remained the only undefeated team in the double-elimination tournament, but the Southern Indiana champions from Newburgh, Ind., toppled South 8-0 on Sunday.

In the deciding game Monday, South reversed that score, leaving little room for doubt as it pounded the Hoosiers 19-2.

South put itself in the driver's seat by beating Redford (15-4), North Farmington-West Bloomfield II (12-1), Lakeland (13-6) and Evansville, Ind., (8-7) in its first four games.

SF in AABC play

South Farmington's Mickey Mantle ballclub began its quest for a second straight district championship today in the American Amateur Baseball Congress tournament in Ann Arbor.

Having wrapped up its Little Caesar's schedule with a 9-0 win over Walked Lake Western last Saturday, South was scheduled to meet Jackson at 10 a.m. at Veterans Park.

The five-team tournament runs through Saturday and will include representatives from Ann Arbor, Hillsdale and Macomb County. The winner goes to the state tournament at Coldwater.

In the regular-season finale, Ben Underwood came within two outs of pitching a no-hitter. With one out in the seventh inning, Underwood still hadn't allowed a hit, but Western spoiled the bid with back-to-back singles.

South's center fielder charged a fly ball and attempted a sliding catch in hopes of preserving the no-hitter, but the ball dropped in for a hit.

UNDERWOOD, 4-2, ended up throwing a two-hitter in which he struck out seven and walked three.

South, 17-5-1 in the league and 23-7-1 overall, produced nine hits in support of Underwood. Billy Hardy, Chris Schmidt and Kevin Young had two hits apiece. Jay Alexander hit a two-run single, and Schmidt drove in single runs with each hit.

Young, Dave Miracle, Scott Lakatos and Eric Miller chipped in one RBI apiece.

In its previous game, South suffered a 13-9 loss to Birmingham last Friday. The game was suspended after five innings on June 20 with the score tied 9-9.

Birmingham scored four runs after two were out in the bottom of the sixth inning to break the deadlock. All four were unearned.

Schmidt, who pitched the last two innings, suffered his first defeat after five victories.

Paul Pirronello was 4-for-4 with a home run and two RBIs. Miracle had two homers and five RBIs while going 3-for-4 and Hardy, who was 2-for-4, also hit a home run and had three RBIs.

Miracle and Pirronello were the leading hitters with .550 and .510 averages, respectively. Following them were Miller at .430, Alexander .420, Lakatos .410, Young .390 and Underwood and Hardy .380.

Miracle hit a team-high five home runs and had 36 RBIs, but Young was the leader with 38 RBIs. Schmidt was tops on the pitching staff with a 5-1 record, 0.76 earned run average and two saves.
