The latest in aging research, education and current events will be explored by more than 600 older adults and professionals in the field of aging at the statewide biennial Governor's Conference on Aging, says Olivia P. Maynard, director of the Office of Services to the Aging.

Headed the array of speakers is keynote Dr. Joyce Brothers, psychologist, columnist and author. Brothers will present the main address at the opening plenary session at 2 p.m. Monday, Oct. 17, in the Grand Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids.

James H. Schultz of Brandeis University in Waltham, Mass., is the luncheon speaker on the first full day of the conference, Tuesday, Oct. 18. The professor of economics and aging policy will talk on "The Continuing Battle: Private Versus Public Provision of Income in Old Age."

Closing luncheon speaker Deloris McBain of WMAQ-TV in Chicago worked with the station on the award-winning project "Your Golden Years." Intended to provide positive programming for the elderly, the project earned recognition from the Illinois Broadcasters Association, Helen Cody Awards and the Presidents Citation Program for Private Sector Initiatives.
