Roofing-sponsored grant awarded to 4 students

Four Metro-Detroit students will attend college this fall thanks, in part, to \$700 scholarship grants.

John Stenson, a 25-year-old Farmington resident who initiated the Scholarship Program three years ago, is one of four honorees in whose name a grant is awarded.
