Seniors matched up with homeless pets

The Michigan Humane Society is kicking off the second year of a national campaign to match area senior citizens with homeless shelter pets as part of the Purina Pets for People Program.

The nationwide program has helped bring more than 15,000 senior citizens and pets together during the first year with 120 in the Detroit area. In addition to making area seniors happy, the program has helped

reduce the number of homeless pets in the shelter.

The Pets for People Program, sponsored by Ralston Purina Co., enables qualifying seniors to adopt a dog or cat from their local shelter completely free of charge. The program covers adoption fees, initial veterinary care, including inoculations and spaying or neutering, and provides the senior with a starter kit that includes a leash, collar, food and water bowls and a starter supply of Purina Dog Chow or Cat Chow.

More than 100 shelters or humane societies in 90 cities nationwide participate in the program. An additional 100 shelters will join the program on a part-time basis this year during August and September, a time when pet overpopulation at shelters traditionally is at its highest.

Studies show that pets can provide health benefits to senior citizens. In addition to companionship, a dog or cat provides a sense of security and protection as well as a source of entertainment and unqualified affection.

Area pet owners can also help senior citizens benefit from the program through grocery store purchases. For every pound of Purina pet food sold in August and September, Purina will donate 10 cents to the Pets for People Program — a donation totaling up to one-half million dollars nationally.
