# Farmington gets 1st victory in 20T

Farmington's first victory in girls basketball was a dramatic event as the Falcons edged Redford Union in double overtime Thursday.

Jennifer McGlinch nailed a free throw to break a 44-44 tie with a minute left in the second overtime, and Marisa Ferrari's jumper with 30 seconds to play gave Farmington a 47-44 win at RU.

Ferrari, with nine points and 10 rebounds, was the leading scorer and rebounder for the Falcons, 1-2. Kirsten Norman finished with eight points.

The Panthers, making their season debut, were down 10-0 at the start of the game but battled back to within two, 32-30, after three periods and tied it, 40-40, at the end of regulation.

Ann Kolar's basket sent the game into overtime. RU also needed a field goal at the buzzer to force the second extra session with the score deadlocked at 42.

The Falcons managed to survive early foul trouble involving Erika Hatcher, who had six first-quarter points, and Melissa Tisdale. RU's Janine Sorel, who fouled out with 4 1/2 minutes left in regulation play, led all scorers with 17 points. Carrie Burke added nine and Kolar six.

**N. FARMINGTON 77, HARRISON 31:** The Raiders got back on the winning track at the expense of their crosstown rival Thursday.

Sophomore Eve Claar tossed in 21 points to pace North, 2-1 overall. The Raiders led 30-19 at halftime and won going away after outscoring the Hawks 22-4 in the third quarter.

Four players recorded double figures for the Raiders, with Kim Gurecki getting 16, Deb Weintraub 12 and Vikki Seamonis 11.

Karen Najarian's 11 points was tops for the Hawks, who fell to 0-3.

## Falcons dominate meet

Farmington was cruising, not on Woodward Avenue, but the cross country trail at Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus Thursday.

The Falcon boys team raced past Waterford Kettering and Birmingham Seaholm in its 1988 debut.

With Brad Moore capturing first place at 17:37, Farmington posted 19 team points, Kettering 54 and the Maples 69.

Waterford's Dan DeLong slipped into the No. 2 spot at 18:09, but the Falcons grabbed the next five places.

While Moore was out in front of the pack, 38 seconds were all that separated the Farmington's best six runners.

Ben Goba lost a foot race with DeLong, taking third in 18:10. Matt Langdon was fourth at 18:12, Mark Mitchell fifth, 18:19; Paul Brandt sixth, 18:30; and Greg Endres seventh, 18:48.

Farmington coach Jerry Young acknowledged the Falcons "looked good" in their debut but cautioned the opposition will be much tougher down the road.

"We have a decent group, but we have a ways to go," he said. "We lack experience, and we've had some injuries."
