## New bus stop is proposed

A Farmington Hills parent has requested a new, more convenient bus stop be added because of concern about Betsy Republic, a private facility in Farmington Hills, which houses the majority of the state.

Judith Halbert, a resident of Karen Place near Nine Mile and Middlebelt, asked the Farmington school board Sept. 4 to consider adding a stop at the end of her street for middle school students.

She is not only concerned that students will have to walk in the road during winter months, but that the neighborhood is in close proximity to the Betsy Republic facility, also on Nine Mile.

Halbert said she became concerned after seeing recent news reports about a ER resident being charged with the murder of an elderly River Rouge woman.

Superintendent Graham Lewis said he would discuss the matter with the transportation department, in light of Halbert's concerns.
