INS going after local businesses

from Hong Kong, according to Farkowski. The illegal workers were scheduled for deportation hearings. Owners of the restaurant, Sonny and Paula Wang, were not available for comment.

UNDER THE new law, employers must also complete employment eligibility forms on employees, verifying their residency through birth certificates, naturalization papers, passports or other documents.

Immigration agent John Kalabus said that 50 percent of the time it is obvious when paperwork has been intentionally done wrong or left incomplete.

Employers who do not comply with this part of the law are also subject to fines.

But in an effort to nurture employer cooperation, immigration agents are so far only issuing warnings.

"This is a cooperative effort on

our part. We only fine those employers who intentionally are not complying with the law," Montgomery said.

Half of all companies that are inspected come in the attention of immigration agents through tips supplied by either the Department of Labor or the public, reporting what is believed to be instances of illegal employment.

Such a tip alerted agents to Ralph's Deli in Bloomfield Hills last month. The caller reported illegal workers. But Kalabus, the investigating agent, said no illegal aliens were employed by the deli. He issued a warning about incomplete records.

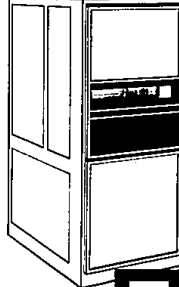
KALABUS is one of 25 criminal investigators in the Detroit Immigration office. He inspects some 15 companies a month.

Many companies are inspected on a random basis, chosen by computer from a list of area firms.
