A financial planner often begins by assessing a client's current bud-

This might release discretionary dollars that weren't there before, says Joseph Giordano, president of Financial Advisory, Inc. Giordano says goals must constantly be reviewed, since a person's financial situation can change dramatically in a short time. Recent Social Security Adminis-

tration statistics reveal that Social Security benefits only replace 40 percent of pre-retirement earnings for an average worker. But careful planning now may help people to live comfortably after retirement.
