

police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

● BURGLARY SUSPECT

A 21-year-old Farmington Hills man whom officers pursued into Southfield was charged with burglary and receiving and concealing stolen property after jewelry from four houses was found in his car Friday. A loaded pistol also was found in the car, police said.

Arraigned Saturday before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the man stood mute to one count of breaking and entering of an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny, three counts of receiving and concealing stolen property over \$100 and one count of

carrying a concealed weapon, all felonies. He also was charged with failing to obey a police officer's signal, a misdemeanor.

Innocent pleas were entered in his behalf. He faces a penalty of up to 15 years in prison if convicted. Cash/surety bond was set at \$50,000 pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court.

The break-ins occurred Friday on Appleton, Greythorne and Castlewleigh in Farmington Hills and on Rougecrest in Southfield. Jewelry was stolen from each. A camera and a .32-caliber pistol also were stolen from the house on Castlewleigh. Most of the stolen property was recovered from the suspect's car, said Farmington Hills detective Doug Anderson.

The Farmington Hills Police Department's Crime Suppression Unit working the 11 Mile-Instar area because of increased break-ins noticed a suspicious car on Branchester at 2:40 p.m. Friday.

Combined with information about a break-in that had occurred on nearby Appleton, officers followed the car. When they tried to stop it on 11 Mile and again on Telegraph in Southfield, the driver eluded them. On the Lodge Freeway in Southfield, the driver bailed out after his car collided with two patrol cars. He was arrested in the median after a short chase.

Also found in the car was property

taken from a house on Briarhill in the 10 Mile-Middlebelt area Sept. 15. No charges have been filed in connection with that burglary, Anderson said.
