

Eighth Amendment dramatized

In bringing back "the stocks" cruel and unusual punishment?

This dramatization of the Eighth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution is to be enacted at North Farmington High School at 3 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 16. The audience, which portrays the New England Town Meeting, will be the judge.

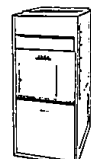

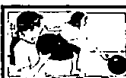

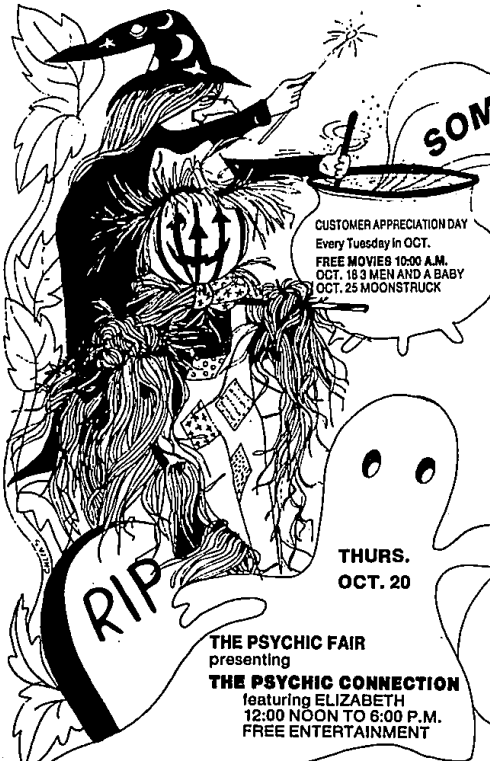
