

OU kickers cement Central Regional status

The march continued for Oakland University's soccer team, the final objective — a No. 1 seeding in the Central Region and the first-round bye to the NCAA Division II tournament that accompanies it — now clearly in sight.

The last major hurdle separating the Pioneers from that goal was cleared Saturday with two second-half goals in a 2-2 tie that carried them to a 2-0 triumph at Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill.

On Tuesday, OU improved to 15-2-3 with a 2-0 win over Eastern Michigan at OU. The victories cemented OU's position as the top team in the Central Region. But there was more; Seattle Pacific lost last weekend to the University of Portland. The defeat, combined with OU's wins, allowed the Pioneers to supplant SP as the second-ranked team in the national coaches' poll, the highest ranking ever for OU.

GOING INTO Saturday's game, the Pioneers had been plagued by problems, particularly at the scoring end of the field. First the right lineup had to be assembled; then a mid-season scoring slump had to be endured. And just when those ills seemed cured, injuries sidelined four of OU's top five scorers.

Those problems started to melt away against Lewis. Earl Parris continued his fine play, but the best news came from Paul Phillips, who led the Pioneers in scoring last year

but has struggled most of this season. Phillips ended a 13-game scoring streak at the 53:37 mark when he lofted a shot past Lewis keeper Jeff Baran, with Parris and Mikael Carlstrom assisting.

Lewis had no time to regroup. At 57:59, Alan Stewart — who had been sidelined with an injured ankle — drilled a shot into the right side of the net. Parris started the scoring play 25 yards from the net. He chipped a pass to Phillips in the penalty area, and Phillips headed the ball to Stewart.

AGAINST EMU, the Pioneers dominated. John Stewart converted after a corner kick by his brother Alan before the match was six minutes old. Dan Weinburgh also assisted. At 23:23, Parris scored with John Stewart and Phillips assisting.

The two shutouts raised keeper Ralph Torre's total to 10 for the season. It also stretched OU's unbeaten streak to 10 games, and gave the Pioneers their ninth-straight 14-win season.

They have one regular-season game remaining, at 3 p.m. Friday at Central Michigan.

OU VOLLEYBALL: The Lady Pioneers are within striking distance of their first Great Lakes Conference volleyball title after beating Lake Superior State 5-15, 15-10, 15-6, 15-10 in their final GLIAC road match of the season Saturday. OU improved to 11-1 in the confer-

ence with four matches remaining, all at home. Grand Valley State, in second place, fell 2½ games behind by losing to Northern Michigan Saturday. GVSU is 9-4. Defending champion Ferris State is 8-4 and Wayne State, which lost to LSSU Friday, is 8-5.

Tracey Jones had 14 kills in 31 attacks with seven errors (226), one solo block and four block assists against the Lakers (6-5 in the GLIAC, 14-10 overall).

Institute 15-9, 15-10, 13-15, 15-13. Jones had 13 kills in 30 attacks with five errors (267), two solos, 11 block assists and eight digs. Anne Harrison added 10 kills in 20 attacks with two errors (400), nine block assists and eight digs.

OU is 17-7 overall. On Friday and Saturday, the Lady Pioneers play at the Ashland (Ohio) College Tournament.

OU SWIMMING: Both the men's and women's swim teams opened

their seasons Saturday with second-place finishes at the Bowling Green State Relays.

The men's team was edged by the host Falcons, 280-277. Eastern Michigan was third (270) in the six-team field. In the three-team women's meet, BGSU edged OU 297-285. EMU was third with 268.

Hilton Woods, Dave Rogowski and Scott Harris each swam on three first-place relays. All three were on the winning 200-yard (1:24.99) and 500-yard (4:08.75) freestyle relays. Harris and Rogowski were also members of the 400 free relay (3:10.5) and Woods was on the 300 backstroke relay (1:42.93).

For the Lady Pioneers, two

swimmers reached NCAA II qualifying standards with swims leading off relays. Dana Kennedy, a sophomore from Birmingham Groves, set a new OU record in the 50 free and qualified for the NCAA II meet (24.20) in the 200 free relay, which finished first (1:38.64).

Freshman Katie Hill led off the 300 butterfly relay with a 1:09.47 time of 59.15, also a NCAA qualifier.

Another freshman, Kerry Leavoy, was on three winning relays: the 500 free (4:43.91), the 400 free (3:38.58) and the 200 free. The 400 free relay, which included Lynn Schermer, Lisa Gulliflowe and Kennedy, also made the NCAA II qualifying standard.
