## WAND speaks up against war toys

"Disarming the Toy Chest" is the topic for WAND (Women's Action for Disarmament), at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 15, in the Southfield Civic Center.

Speakers will be Mary Carry, coordinator of the Peace and National Priorities Center of Oakland County, and Dr. Morris Davidson, psychologist and educator.

Discovery Toys, which are oriented toward peaceful and creative play, will be displayed.

A national petition against the production and promotion of "war toys" will be circulated. It says, in part, "These toys are harmful because they desensitize children to the real horrors of violence and wars."

Carry, a former teacher, is a member of Pax Christi-USA Task Force on Alternatives to Violence, a peace activist, and traveled to Nicaragua and El Salvador recently. Her Peace Center houses an extensive library of videotapes and slide shows that demonstrate the values of peace and the elimination of violence in the home. These visuals are available at no charge.

Carry will present one of these slide-shows at the WAND meeting. She contends, "War Toys are influencing children toward violence by bringing out their aggressive tendencies." Her goal is to teach families better communication, the affirmation of children, cooperation and the elimination of the influence of violent toys.

Davidson, area founder of Psychologists for Social Responsibility,

will speak on recent research on the effect of children playing with military toys.

"Children's work is children's play," Davidson said. "How they play is how they are learning to function in an adult world." He feels "thoughtful parents are distressed by the number and variety of military toys and at the children's response or seeing the weapons as commonplace."

**THE PUBLIC** may attend. There is no admission charge. The session will be in the Southfield Library in the Civic Center at 26000 Evergreen Road, between 10 and 11 Mile. There is a free indoor parking at the rear of the building.

WAND is a national organization that encourages women to empower themselves to participate in shaping U.S. policies toward a world free of the threat of nuclear war and to help build a stable peace. There are 11,000 members in 35 states.

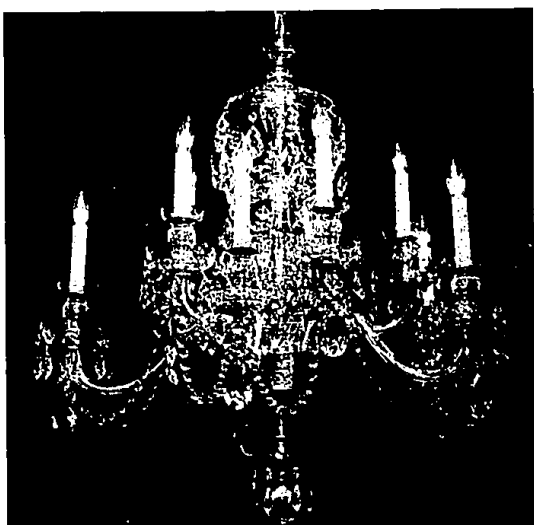
