NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT COMBINED WITH NOTICE TO PUBLIC OF REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS: On or about November 28, 1988 the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:

Grand River Sidewalk Improvements - which included the removal of damaged sidewalks and the installation of replacement sidewalks along Grand River, between Eight Mile and Tuck Roads. Estimated cost \$10,000.00.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly, the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

The project will improve existing pedestrian walkway conditions and will not disturb natural features of the environment such as vegetation, water courses or wildlife.

An Environmental Review Board respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request at the Community Development Office between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. to the City Manager at 31555 W. 11 Mile, Farmington Hills, Michigan 48018 on or before November 25, 1988. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. will not request the release of Federal Funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence. Farmington Hills will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Farmington Hills is certifying to HUD that Farmington Hills and William M. Costick in his official capacity as City Manager, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, Farmington Hills may use the Block Grant funds, and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval of the release of funds and acceptance of the certification only if it is on one of the following bases (a) That the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer of applicant approved by HUD; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58), and may be addressed to HUD at Department of Housing and Urban Development, Federal Building, 477 Michigan Avenue, Detroit, Michigan 48226. Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after December 15, 1988 will be considered by HUD.
