CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 14, 1988

Mayor Soronen opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on November 14, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Mayor Soronen, Mayor Pro-Tem Sever, Alkatech, Dolan, Fox, and Vagstad. Members absent: Marks. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Dorman, Assistant City Manager Call, Director of Public Services Blaisell, and City Attorney Elbeau.

Council adopted Resolution No. 3 (for the installation of water main on Salem Road, north of Village Lane and for Village Lane, west of Valley Road) and Resolution No. 4 (Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds).

Council adopted Resolution No. 3 (for road improvement for Robinson Avenue, 8 Mile to Tilman, Quince Avenue, 8 Mile to Tilman, and Tilman from Quince to 8 Mile west of Robinson) and Resolution No. 4 (Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds).

Council received Presentation of Audited Financial Report by Plante & Moran, Inc. for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 1988.

Council received Presentation on activation of "E-911" Emergency Phone System.

Council authorized City Manager to proceed with the Farmington Hills "Year 2000 Plan."

Council authorized City to participate in the L.C.M.A. Future Visions Program and withdrew its membership in the Michigan Innovation Group.

Council confirmed the appointment of Jack Jorja as Planning Commission member to fill a vacancy with term to expire 1/1/90.

Council set deadline of 4:30 p.m., December 6, 1988 for receipt of resume/letter of interest in filling vacancy of Council member Jan Dolan, effective January 1, 1989.

Council approved Final Plat for Green Valley Estates No. 3 Subdivision.

Council approved extension of Preliminary Plat of Green Valley Estates Subdivision until October 14, 1990.

Council agreed not to take action at this time to pave and/or extend sanitary sewer service to Goldsmith Street.

Council consented to Transfer of Employment of Quality Steel Products, Inc. of Farmington Hills to the Township of Milford.

Council approved request for special event permit for Arboretum Properties, 24500 W. 13 Mile Road, for hot air balloon and skydiver search light for Wednesday, 11/16/88 from 8:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Council approved minutes of October 3, 1988, as amended; October 17, 1988, as published; and, October 24, 1988, as amended.

Council agreed to hold an executive session immediately following the meeting to discuss pending litigation.
