Several grades of unleaded gas are sold, based on their octane rat-ing. Octane is the gasoline property that measures the engine's resist-ance to knocking.
Unleaded gas has a minimum oc-tane rating of 87. Unleaded premium has a 91 octane rating. Some compa-nies offer a mid-octane gas at 89.
To determine which octane is best for your car, refer to your car's
