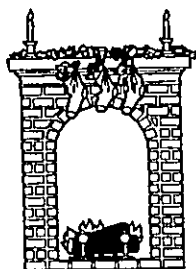

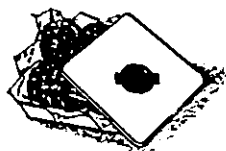

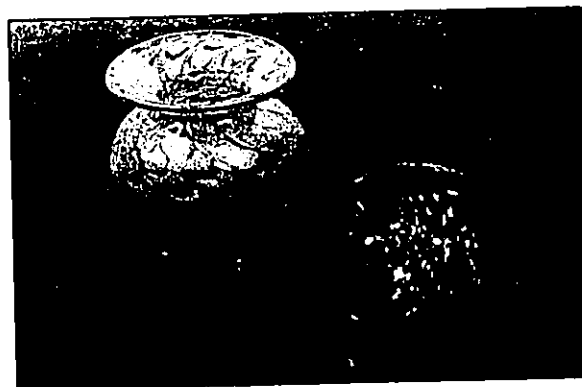

wooden spreader and a box of special crackers.

### OLD-FASHIONED CORN RELISH

- 1/2 cup vinegar
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon celery seed
- 1/4 teaspoon mustard seed
- 1/4 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 1 1/2 cups cooked corn kernels, drained
- 2 tablespoons chopped pimiento
- 1 tablespoon minced white or green onion.

Yields 1 1/2 cups

Combine first six ingredients in medium saucepan and bring to boil. Cook two minutes, remove from heat and cool. Place remaining ingredients in medium bowl. Add cooled mixture and blend lightly. Chill. Pack in pint canning jar and top with a circle of ginger ham tied with a red yarn bow.

**NOW FOR WRAPPING** it up: first some practical matters: Be sure to label all of the edibles you give. Invest in some printed labels that list your name and the contents, for example, "Sugar cookies from the kitchen of Susan Jones."

If your gift needs to be baked or reheated, include the instructions. Wrap fragile cookies and candies in tissue to prevent breakage, and use

lots of shredded paper or packing straw when you pack boxes or baskets of food.

Let your imagination run wild! Even a last-minute item picked up at an all-night convenience store can take on a personal charm with imaginative packaging.

The most delightful containers can turn up in the most unusual places. Browse through antique and thrift shops for cut-glass dishes, earthen crocks, granite bowls and interesting bottles and jars. An import store will yield baskets of every size and shape. Stop at the florist's for clay pots and colorful ceramic containers.

Discount and hardware stores can provide inexpensive dishes, glasses, crockery and cutting boards, and at kitchen stores you'll find all kinds of gadgets to dress up your edible gifts — a pancake turner to go with a bottle of maple syrup, a juicer to nestle in a fruit basket.

An especially thoughtful addition to a gift of food is a personal memento. Fill a pottery mug with imported coffee beans for friends who like to grind their own.

Pack a toy Porsche with a selection of nuts for an automobile enthusiast or a practical engagement calendar with a box of your home-baked chocolate chip cookies for a busy executive.

The happy recipient will be thinking of you long after the food is gone, when the holidays are just a pleasant memory.
