'Native American Spirituality' continues Womencenter series

"Dreaming Our Vision - Creating Our Reality," a series sponsored by Womencenter, continues with a workshop called "Native-American Spirituality." The session is headed up by Debbie Mast, a registered nurse who teaches meditation and visualization to cancer patients, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 3, on Orchard Ridge Campus, Oakland Community College. Fee for the entire session is \$5. Pre-registration is necessary, made by calling Womencenter, 471-7602.

Each segment of the series is called a "process gathering." On these occasions, women come together to explore their emerging feminine spirituality, to listen to one another, share experiences and define themselves as women, as human, as sexual, as healers, as participants in life and ritual and spiritual growth.

Participants bring a brown bag lunch. Beverages are provided. Childcare is available for children

under 7 years, but they must be registered ahead of time. Mast, who belongs to an Indian Lodge in the metro area, thinks of the healing work she does as a grounding for the balance of spirit, mind and body energy. She calls it "connectedness." Her philosophy stems from the American Indian and his respect for all nature. Sessions throughout the day will include chanting, ritual, movement and dance to bring the connectedness.
