"Pormer Franklin police officer Ben David wept openly in court Wednesday after learning he would have to spend at least 30 days in jail. "I apologise for everything that has happened," he told Judge Marga- 15 Schaffer. "I have done wrong" to the community, his family and his fellow police officers, he said. David's sentencing in 47th District. Court in Farmington followed last month's guilty pleas to destroying evidence in a Franklin drug case admitted to the computer information white monilighting for a private investigator.
