"You can really feel the grief. That loss, that sorrow, that vold," said Farmington Hills resident Marty Kröhner, ocfounder of both the Mothers Against Drunk Driving Oakland County chapter and the MADD statewide umbrella organization.

"We are really trying to bring out the grief and the anguish that's associated with this type of offense," said Krohner, an attorney with the Wayne County prosecutor's office. Krohner sald the recently passed state constitutional amendment for victims rights is an important step toward the goals MADD supports. "We've seen a decline in fatailles, golten some legislation passed," he added. "But we're not satisfied with what's come out of the judicial system."

The access road, McAllister said, will "increase traffic, definitely increase speed and seriously compromise all the achievements the city council and residents have worked to achieve."




