

## Rebate checks in mail

The state Treasury Department has begun mailing 1988 homestead property tax rebate checks to senior citizens who filed early.
"This is the third straight year we have been able to send property tax rebate checks to seniors before they have to pay their December property tax bill." said state treasurer Robert Bowman. The Treasury Department has delivered to the postal sys-

tem 1,993 senior rebate checks totaling \$1.2 million. Before 1986, Bowman said, sen-iors and all other Michigan residents iors and all other hitengan residents received their property tax rebate checks in the spring after filling their income tax returns. By receiving their credit checks early, seniors are assured of having enough money to make their winter tax payments to local governments.
