The Farmington Public Schools will receive sealed Proposals from qualified bidders for the Farmington High School Media Center Additions and Renovations - Phase I consisting of Bid Divisions 101: Demolition 102: Site Utilities: 103: Footings and Foundations: 104: Steel and Steel Erection: 105: Hydraulic Elevator.

There will be a pre-bid meeting held on Wednesday, December 21, 1988, 3:00 PM, at the Farmington High School Library, 32000 Shawansee, Farmington, Michigan.

Proposals may be mailed or delivered in person to the Lewis Schulman Administration Center, 32500 Shawansee, Farmington, Michigan 48024, Attn: Beverly Hausman. Proposals must be received "prior" to 5:30 p.m. (local time), on January 18, 1989. Proposals will be opened publicly and read aloud. All bids will be evaluated at a later date.

The Project will utilize separate prime contracts. All contracts for construction will be direct contracts with the Owner. Overall coordination of the Project will be the responsibility of the construction management firm, McCarthy & Smith, Inc./FS&V, Incorporated—a Joint Venture.

The Owner will award contracts on or about January 24, 1989, to separate Contractors for separate Bid Divisions or combinations of bid divisions. Any Bidder, at his option, may submit a combined Proposal for any combination of Bid Divisions by offering a Combined Bid Deduct. A separate Bid must be submitted for each Bid Division included in any such combined Proposal.

All Project procedures and documents are designed to facilitate delivery of the Project through multiple prime construction contracts. The Owner's forms, rather than industry master forms, are used for all documents. Bidders shall read and review the Bidding Documents carefully, and shall familiarize themselves thoroughly with all requirements.

Requests by Contractors for inclusion as bidders shall be addressed to the Construction Manager. One set of Bidding Documents will be provided free of charge to Bidders. The Bidding Documents are on file for inspection at the Architect's office. A \$50.00 document replacement charge will be assessed only if the Documents are not returned to the Project Team in good and usable condition.
