

Too big to handle

North heavyweight faces giant in final

When the Oakland County Wrestling Meet finally ended Saturday night — more than 24 hours after it had begun — there were plenty of heavy eyes and weary bodies left at Oakland Community College.

And one very happy man in Hazel Park coach Frank Slagg.

Hazel Park finished the two-day tournament with 214.5 points to outdistance second-place Lake Orion (195.5) and win its eighth Oakland County title in nine years. Lake Orion won the crown last year, unseating the Vikings, who had won the previous seven County meets.

Avondale had the best showing among Observer & Eccentric area schools, placing sixth with 161.5 points.

Hazel Park's depth was the difference this year, as seven Viking wrestlers placed among the top six in their respective weight classes.

"OUR OVERALL depth kept us going," Slagg said. "Any time you can have depth, you've got to be happy about it."

This is a giant meet. The logistics of operating a meet like this are mind boggling.

The 41-team meet, which began with preliminary matches Friday afternoon finally ended a little after 9 p.m. Saturday night.

It was a grueling two days of work, but worth the effort, said West Bloomfield coach Greg Alessi, whose team placed ninth (141.5). By day's end Saturday Alessi was on an ecstatic, though exhausted, coach.

"We've had a long two days," he said. "We were here 12 hours yesterday and 14 hours today. Every one's hoarse and emotionally drained. I'm happy but tired. We've exceeded our expectations."

FINISHING BEHIND Lake Orion in third place was Clarkston (191.0). Waterford Kettering placed fourth (170.5), followed by Pontiac Northern in fifth place (168.0).

Troy Athletes (142.5), West Bloomfield and Rochester (140.0) finished eighth, ninth and 10th, respectively. North Farmington (133.5) placed 11th and Troy (115.0) was 13th.

This was Athens' best finish ever at the Oakland County Meet, and Mark Vetter paced the Red Hawks' effort with a title at 130.

"I told the kids that outside of the state meet, the county meet is the biggest around," Athens coach Bill Wilder said. "I couldn't be happier."

Seniors Robert Wolfe and Dan Mather buoyed Avondale's sixth-place finish, winning the 140 and 145-pound weight classes, respectively.

This was Mather's third consecutive Oakland County title, and that's quite an accomplishment.

"THERE'S AN endurance factor, not just physical but mental as well," Avondale coach Ray Went said. "Mather is a very skilled athlete. He has natural ability, works hard and is a fine leader."

Robert (Wolfe) had to work to overcome physical limitations. He works so hard and has tremendous intensity. As a coach I can use him as an example to the others. He wears people down."

Other Eccentric winners included Troy's Jeff Bates, who won the 160-pound title with a pin in 59 seconds.

West Bloomfield had a champion in Roland Kays, who claimed the 119-pound title, while Rochester's Shane Camera won the 171-pound title.

Saturday's championship flight began with one of the best matches, pitting heavyweight Zalm Cummulis of North Farmington against Berkley's 6-foot-7 Helios Tengel. Tengel prevailed 16-6 over Cummulis, whose record dipped to 10-1.

"Two wrestled guys 270 before but never anyone that tall," Cummulis said. "I wanted to shoot his legs and ride on his legs but I couldn't get any leverage against him."

NORTH COACH Dick Cook accepted blame for Cummulis's loss. "I didn't coach him right," Cook said. "I underestimated Tengel's size. Zalm is 6-foot-1 but he looked like an ant against him. I told Zalm to go and hit him and pick him up. That was the wrong thing to tell him."

Observer & Eccentric area performers that made it to the final round before losing included West Bloomfield's Denny Rapp (112), North Farmington's Matt Thompson (135) and Troy's Dave Bulynek (152). Troy coach Gary Harlan defended Bulynek and Bates, the 160-pound winner, for their performances.

"We were hoping for them to be in the finals," Harlan said. "Both are senior captains and work real hard in practice. When they're doing practicing they don't even need to take showers because they're so wet from sweat."
