Science foundation staff leads youth on winter camp days

One way to rid post-holiday blues is register children for Winter Survival Camp in Farmington Community Center. In cooperation with Living Science Foundation, the center will offer three daylong sessions Wednesday through Friday, Dec. 28-30, for children aged 6-12 years.

Focusing on nature's winter survival tactics, each of the three sessions will cover a different theme. Dec. 28 the topic will be "Animal Survival — How Different Species Survive the Winter Months," and activities will include making bird feeders for winter friends.

"WINTER SKIES" will be the theme Dec. 29 when one of the day's highlights will be observing winter constellations and planets in the star lab planetarium.

Dec. 30 the topic will be "World Weather Patterns" where youngsters will explore worldwide climate systems and have a hands on experience while making snow in a box.

At each session the staff of Living Science Foundation will bring live animals including reptiles, amphibians, mammals and birds to show how these species adapt to the winter season. Sessions will last from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
