

Hoffman aims North to win

Matt Hoffman still isn't 100 percent, according to North Farmington boys basketball coach Tom Negoshian. But he was good enough Friday against visiting Walled Lake Central.

Hoffman, who has been bothered by a sprained ankle, was "about 90 percent," Negoshian said. He scored 23 points and passed out 10 assists and the Raiders — who led 17-10 after one quarter and 37-26 at the half — were never threatened in their 74-50 win.

OCC overcomes academic losses

The expected onslaught never materialized Wednesday when Schoolcraft College's men's basketball team — which lost four players to academic deficiencies last season — defeated Oakland Community College Wednesday.

One reason could have been the Raiders were hurt by scholastic troubles. Too. Starters Eric Hawkins and Pineda Morgan were both declared academically ineligible at the end of the first semester.

That, combined with the reinstatement of at least one Ocelot (one of center Mark Koronka's grades was reviewed and changed), evened the two teams up a bit. But it wasn't enough to change the outcome. OCC still won, 85-81.

But it would be unwise to step in and make a lot of changes."
