## Farmington board OKs sewer holding tank with conditions

An underground wastewater holding tank, a major part of a multicity sewer project, has been approved by majority vote of the Farmington school board with certain provisions. The board voted 6-1 last week to approve the measure, which would put the four-million-gallon cement tank just behind the O.E. Dunckel Middle School on 12 Mile Road as part of the Farmington/Evergreen regional sewer project.

During heavy rains, the tank would hold storm water from the nearby Kendallwood subdivision for several days until it could be pumped into the sewer system. Trustee Jack Inch, who is concerned because of the tank's proximity to the school building and because of changes made to the original plan, opposed the measure. The \$80 million sewer Improvement project is one of three projects certified by the state Department of Natural Resources that received federal financing through the Environmental Protection Agency.

The EPA's interest has been sparked by environmental damage caused to the Rouge Rilver by sewage flowing linto the river from the involved communities.
