

CC captures tourney title

AT 125 POUNDS, two old rivals met with Davidson's Brad Smith edging CC's Mark Hume, 5-2.

One of CC's biggest surprises came at 145 pounds, where Brian Tulley pinned Tom Bucks of Lansing Eastern in the semifinals before losing to Bedford's Denver Beck in the championship, a pin in 5:15.

CC's other finalist was Lou Yeager (189), who blanked Rick Lowe of Lansing Sexton in the semifinals, 5-0, before being pinned by Warren Lincoln's Ralph Amine.

The other CC wrestlers also placed, including Kevin Rowe, who was fifth at 112 and Mike Gentile, who took third at 125.

Tulley's performance was a plus," said the CC coach. "Chris (Rodriguez) had a couple of good victories. He met two people who had beaten him before and he pinned them both.

"And Lou (Yeager) is getting bet-

The meet, which is often a preview to the state Class A finals, had its share of outstanding individuals.

AMONG THE INDIVIDUAL state champions who captured titles were: Greg Paiz of Grandville (129), Chris Henderson of Sexton (125) and tournament MVP Dean Moscovice (160). Moscovice captured his third

straight CC Invitational crown along with Paiz.

Now 33-9 on the year, Moscovice made an impressive showing for the Warriors along with teammate Kevin Kinane, who also remained undefeated by taking the 119-pound crown.

Also reaching the finals for Rice was Derek Moscovice (103) and Chris Snooks (135).

"I thought we could finish any-

where from first to fifth," said Rice coach John Segula. "The key was our first- and second-round pins. It was an unbelievable amount of pins for us. That showed our scoring and it was a real team effort."

"This invitational is basically a state meet and I was pleased with our effort. Plus, beating Bedford is always nice."

Rodriguez said "winning the 25th meet was special."

"It's pretty hard not to get fired up in your own backyard," he said. "I definitely think we'll be a strong tourney team. We've had some weaknesses throughout the whole year, but we're getting some people back."

N. Farmington trio meets with success

North Farmington came away from Northville's quad wrestling tournament with three perfect individual performances but only a third-place team finish Saturday.

The Raiders defeated Ann Arbor Pioneer 50-24 but lost to Northville 48-26 and South Lyon 39-27.

Posting three wins each for North were Jack Beall (125), Jeff Jacobs (171) and heavyweight Zalm Cummulaj.

Beall, 22-3 overall, beat Northville's Mike Huff 7-4, Pioneer's Max Dombrowski 15-0 and South Lyon's Rob Hays 9-2.

Jacobs pinned Dan Cornell (Pioneer) at 3:52 and Bob Rodloff (South Lyon) in 35 seconds. Jacobs, who is 14-4, also defeated Darren Keahue (Northville) 18-3 on a technical fall.

Cummulaj pushed his overall record to 23-1, recording quick pins over Gary Grob (Pioneer), Derek Forbing (Northville) and Norm Klawender (South Lyon). All three pins were recorded in less than one minute.

Cummulaj is now 14 wins shy of breaking the career record for most wins at North.

Matt Thompson (125) won twice Saturday, pinning Jim Park (Pioneer) in 3:35, and Kevin Delany (Northville) in 1:55.

North Farmington blew past West Bloomfield Tuesday 126-48 in a non-conference boys swimming encounter.

North won all 11 events. Steve Tumey and Chuck Chuba each posted double wins for the visiting Raiders, now 5-0 overall.

Tumey's wins came in the 200-yard freestyle (1:53.69) and the breaststroke (1:05.95). Chuba was victorious in the 50 freestyle (23.06) and the 100 freestyle (52.22).

Chuba and Tumey also were members of the winning 400 freestyle relay team, along with Jerry Gehle and Dan Knipper that clocked 3:36.57. North's 200 medley relay team, consisting of David Adams, Chris Knoche, Doug Schwedland and Keith Lee, also was victorious, finishing in 1:50.37.

Those recording solo titles for North were Knoche, who finished the 200 individual medley in 2:14.14; John Juliano, who won the diving (1:00.45); Schwedland, in the 100 butterfly (59.37); Mike Drelles, in the 100 backstroke (1:02.91).

JEFF NEIKIRK was a double winner Tuesday for host Farmington Harrison, but Westland John Olsen still managed to prevail in the Lakes Division dual meet, 94-76.

Neikirk won the 50 freestyle (24.05) and the 100 freestyle (53.45). Neikirk, Chad Hughes, Bill Wolford and Jason Barringer also combined to win the freestyle relay in 3:45.3.

Other winners for Harrison included Barringer, who clocked a 1:07.72 in the breaststroke (1:07.72), and Ryan Knoche, who won the diving with 204.50 points.

Chad Hughes won the 100 butterfly for Harrison in 1:01.44, and Ed Serzo recorded an Oakland County qualifying time of 1:03.26 in the 100 backstroke.

CC tankers cruise past Chargers

The Redford Catholic Central swimming team improved to 4-1 in dual meets Tuesday, scoring a 51-32 triumph over Livonia Churchill in a boys meet at Farmington Mercy.

The non-conference loss drops Churchill to 2-4 overall.

Four Shamrocks claimed individual honors. CC also won both the 200-yard medley relay and the 400 freestyle relay.

Members of the medley relay team that clocked 1:50.36 were: Randy Teeters, Andy Jacobs, Jim Kovach and Ken Graczyk. The 400 freestyle relay team was comprised of Mike Hoefflin, Kovach, Troy Shumate and Alan Asari (3:40.3).

Individual firsts went to Hoefflin, who finished the 200 freestyle in 1:31.63; Shumate, 200 individual medley (2:04.12); Teeters, 100 butterfly (1:06.55); and Asari, 500 freestyle (5:37.92). Shumate's 200 IM time qualified him for the state meet in March.

Mark Peperaki's effort for Churchill was wasted, as he won both the 50 freestyle (23.43) and the 100 backstroke (57.71).

Other Churchill firsts were recorded by Scott Stachernki, diving, 242.85 points; N. Dryden, 100 freestyle, 54.16; and J. Findley, 100 breaststroke, 1:10.43.
